

How to View Your Advisement Report (PDF)

- 1. Login to your <u>UAccess Student Center</u> with your NetID and Password: https://uaccess.arizona.edu/
- 2. Once the homepage loads, it should look like this first image. Click the tab titled "ADVISING."

3. From the drop-down with the list of options, click the second link, titled "Advisement Report."




